



Assemble of Frames, Cloth, and weed cloth base.

Note that the clips, screws and other fixings are sold separately as a kit.





1. Once garden is installed in final location attach a frame parallel to corner at one end. It is helpful to insert a screw in the top hole and rest this on top of the timber. This way you will make sure that the clip that fits on the frame will install correctly.
2. Same to other end.
3. Measure to the center of the garden and install 3rd frame. Best to fix the top screw (second hole from top) on both sides, then adjust so frame is in one plane.
4. Fold cloth in half, place one end of wire with pig tail in existing hole in one side. Fit to other side by compressing the pig tail and inserting into existing hole.
5. Unfold cloth and fix with clip to one end.
6. Fix other end and adjust so that the cloth is centered.
7. Fix black poly clips to cloth. First fold the cloth back on itself so that the poly clip will fix to a double thickness. Make sure that no cloth is visible through the lower of the two holes. Start by fixing the poly clips from the center frame and move to the ends. 3 poly clips between frames. See photo 9.
8. Fix screws through the polyclips, about 75 mm down from the top of the garden working from the center out keeping the cloth tight.
9. Poly clips installed on garden. Note that the whole clip can be lifted off the screws for easy access. Note that there are polyclips and screw supplied for both sides of the garden but I have found that only one side is required.

10. Gather the ends and place a zip tie around the cloth with another one between this one and the cloth. This will leave a loop for you to fix the end.
11. Install hook where required and attached, loosely looped, zip tie.

Note:

- ❖ There will be extra cloth remaining along the garden that can either be trimmed or left. The thermo cloth is the best all round covering material for this garden. It provides added heat, let's rain in, does not create excess humidity and offers some frost protection. I would recommend purchasing a designated frost cloth if you are concerned about more than mild frosts.
- ❖ **The weed cloth**(only used in gardens installed on drives etc to stop soil (fill) washing away. will need to be laid out in the garden in its final position. Center the weed cloth in the garden and fix to the half way up the sides with either staples or garden fill. Once filled and watered there may be some coloured water coming from the garden. In other gardens installed this has stopped.
